
JAPANESE COURSES Japanese Language Classes for Exchange Students

AGU offers level-appropriate classes for exchange students who wish to learn Japanese. Using the placement test, students with a Japanese language

proficiency above a certain level will be assigned to the most appropriate class from a number of levels, and receive credit. On the other hand, students who have not reached a certain level will not receive credit, but will be provided with classes taught in English by external instructors. In addition to Japanese language classes, there are several courses designed for international students to help them develop a comprehensive understanding of Japan, including Japanese culture, politics, and history.


